Coastal Horizons to Break Ground on New Administration Building

WILMINGTON, N.C. — Coastal Horizons will break ground tomorrow, Friday, November 21, 2025, at 2:00 PM on its new Administration Building located at 945 Medical Center Drive. Members of the press are invited to attend, and a photo opportunity with project partners, elected officials, and board members will take place immediately following the ceremony.

The groundbreaking marks an important step in Coastal Horizons' continued growth as the demand for behavioral health, substance use, and supportive services across the region continues to rise. The new Administration Building will enhance organizational efficiency and open valuable space for additional treatment areas at the organization's main campus at 615 Shipyard Boulevard.

"This new building represents a vital investment in our ability to meet the growing needs of our community and state," said Margaret Weller-Stargell, President and CEO of Coastal Horizons. "We are deeply grateful to Senator Michael Lee for securing the \$12 million in capital funding that made this project possible. His unwavering commitment to expanding behavioral health and substance use treatment will have a generational impact on individuals and families across North Carolina."
